Paintstiks on Fabrics!

Fabric

Paintstiks can be used on any type of fabric: cotton, silk, organza, batiks, etc. As for size, Fat Quarters are good for class, but you can also work on a single larger piece of fabric and keep adding to it.

As a minimum have 1 fat quarter of white fabric and/or 1 fat quarter of black fabric for class, so you can try them on both and see how they react. Black looks especially nice if you have a few metallic Paintstiks and lighter colours. You can also use navy or a dark colored fabric instead of black.

Before Class: Please pre-wash (preferably) your fabrics and iron flat, especially if you are planning on washing your fabrics after heat-setting.

Paintstiks

Your choice of how many you use during class. 2-3 is ample to give them a try and get used to the feel of them and how they work. Having 3 different colours will give you more variety. If you only have one, you'll have a beautiful monochromatic piece.

Rubbing Plates

I will be showing you how to make your own rubbing plates using foam core board and sheets of self-adhesive foam, plus foam shapes and such – if you purchased a kit, these supplies are provided in the kit.

If you have not purchased a kit you will need;

1. A sheet of foam core board
2. A few sheets of self-adhesive foam (I find these at Walmart, Michaels and sometimes the dollar store.)
3. Optional: Self-adhesive shapes like letters, circles, animals, etc.

Other Supplies for rubbing plates:

Look around the house. You can use anything as a rubbing plate as long as it has a texture: shelf liner, a piece of plastic grid, washers, mesh, tongue depressors and popsicles sticks, etc.

If you have any commercial rubbing plates, have them handy.

Other Supplies:

- Fabric cutting scissors.
- Paper cutting scissors
- X-acto knife
- Paper, pen, and pencils
- Small trash bag – or have a trash can close to your work area
- Rotary cutter
- Rotary cutting mat
- Ruler – 6” x 12” or similar
- Paper towels
- Painter’s tape
- A few sets of disposable gloves – optional if you don’t want to get paint on your hands
- A plastic or Styrofoam tray or plate to use as a palette
- An old toothbrush
- Stencil brush – optional
- Any stencils you may have
- Freezer paper
- Baby wipes or an old wet towel to wipe your hands with

Before Class:

Please cover your work area with plastic to protect your table.
